

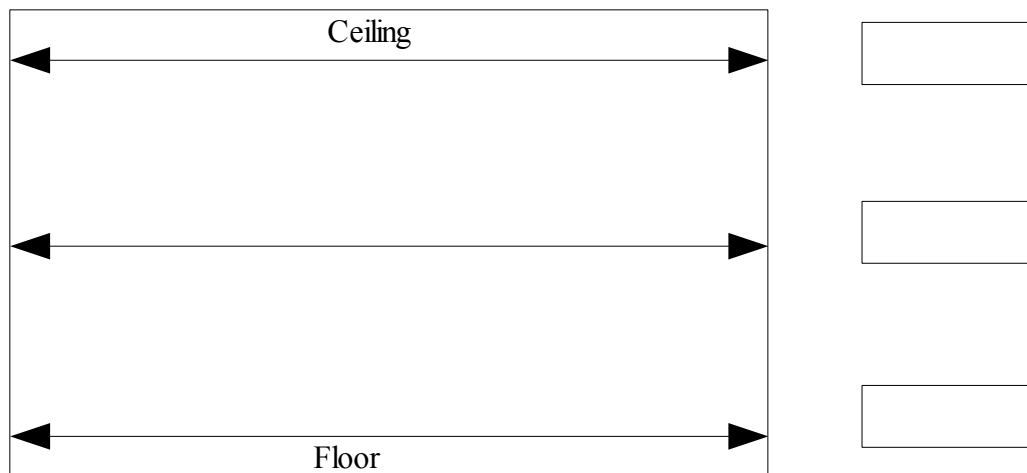


## Design a Wardrobe Measuring Guide

Accurate measuring is key to a great fitting wardrobe. Follow these tips to make sure your measuring is as good as it can be.

1. Ask some-one to help you measure. It's easier with 2.
2. Keep the tape measure tight, if it sags your measurements may be wrong
3. Work in millimetres, it's more accurate
4. Check each measurement at least once.
5. Measure at the point your doors will run, not against the back of the wall. (this is normally 640mm from the back wall.
6. If you are not fitting wall to wall, measure your width to where you want your [end panel](#) to start.
7. Don't measure until you've finished any major decorating or plastering
8. Remember that if you're going to change the carpet or lay new flooring this might affect the height

**Step 1. Measure your width** in 3 places. Write the measurement in each corresponding box.



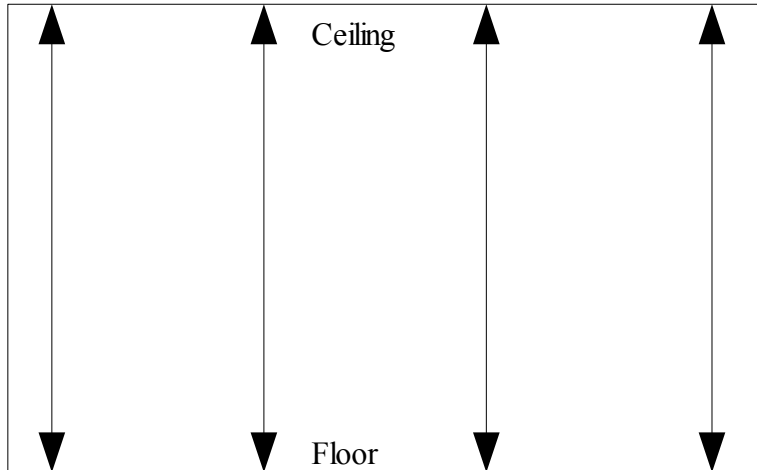
Add the 3 measurements together and divide by 3. This is your average door width.

Make a note of it here

If you are using [wall liners](#) deduct 18mm for each wall liner used and write it here



**Step2. Measure your height** Measure at each end and every meter/yard in between.

If you are using [floor liners](#) deduct 18mm and write number here

**Step 3:** Choose how many doors from your width

Upto 2400 = 2 doors

1750 to 3580 = 3 doors

2300 - 4800mm = 4 doors

2900 - 5000mm = 5 doors
